1. Author Catherine Howe

**'Ireland and English Chartism.**' A brief outline: the talk takes in the history of Chartism with a focus on the relationship between Feargus O'Connor, Chartist leader, and Daniel O'Connell, Ireland's Liberator. Their mutual antagonism arrested Chartist advance in Ireland and turned O'Connor into an exile.

#### Bio

Catherine Howe attended Corona Drama School from 1962-5 and played roles in, amongst other shows, *Dr Who*; *Z*-Cars; *The Wednesday Play*; Theatre 625. In 1969 she signed her first music publishing deal and went on to write songs for seven albums, including *Harry* recorded in 1975 for RCA and for which she received an Ivor Novello. In 1990 she gained a degree in History with Religious Studies from the Open University and began to write books on social history. These books are *Holyoake's Journey 1842*; *Halifax 1842*; *London Story 1848*; 59 *Greek Street, the home of the Theatre Girls' Club.* She is a mother and grandmother.

## "Ideology of Larkin"

This session will focus on the ideology that underpinned Jim Larkin life and actions as a labour organiser and leader. It will outline what specifically informed Larkin's ideological beliefs, how his views changed over time and why these changes occurred.

## Bio

Luke Dineen is a labour and social historian who has written, spoken and presented extensively about the history of the Irish labour movement, especially the history of labour in Cork during the Irish Revolution. In 2019, he was conferred with a PhD in modern Irish history from the School of History, UCC. His thesis was a comparative analysis of the roles the labour movements in Cork and Derry played during the Irish revolution. He is the author of publications on Irish labour history, including articles on the 1921 Cork Harbour Soviet, the 1923 Cork general lockout, the 1909 Cork general lockout, and the Derry general lockout of 1924; a chapter in the Bread Not Profits: Provincial Working-Class Politics During the Irish Revolution (Dublin, 2022); and a comprehensive biography of the Connect Trade Union. He currently works as a civil servant for the Department of Justice.

Bios

Matthew Collins is a well-known anti-fascist campaigner from Britain. Between 1987 and 1993, he was chairman of the London branch of the neo-Nazi National Front.

Born in London to Irish parents, he was one of **many** second-generation Irish who found their way into the violent world of Britain's **far-right and anti-fascist** scene.

There was a shock for his Nazi colleagues, however: Collins had an epiphany **in 1989**, and unbeknownst to anyone but a tiny handful of trusted colleagues—he began passing information to anti-fascists.

Formerly active in the **NF**, **British National Party**, and **Combat 18**, **Collins's actions all but** destroyed the NF, and he played a significant role in the **dramatic first exposure** of Combat 18's self-declared **'terror machine'**.

Now one of the UK's leading researchers into the **extreme far-right**, **his extraordinary life and research have** been published in three books. But perhaps the escapades of **'the fat James Bond'** are better known **from** the Netflix drama **The Walk-In**, **where Stephen Graham played Collins—bringing down the terror group National Action** by foiling their plot to murder a British **MP**.

**Shane O'Curry** has been active in human rights organisations in Ireland, north and south, since 1997, specialising in ethnic conflict and hate incident monitoring. He is the Director of INAR – the Irish Network Against Racism- where he works with Network members to coordinate common network policy responses to racism. Shane has made policy submissions addressing structural, cultural and institutional racism at a national level as well as to the EU, OSCE, ECRI and UN. He is co-author on a recent Policing Authority report on the policing of minorities in the republic of Ireland.
